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
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

FROM THE CO-FOUNDER

I am so inspired whenever someone calls or texts me, "I just went to see _ (Wicked, Lion King, Chicago) on Broadway and it was incredible!"

As people are repeatedly flocking to movie theatres to see Wicked and telling me how much they love it, I remind them, "You know, the New York Times panned the show and said, "Wicked does not, alas, speak hopefully for the future of the Broadway musical." And yet, Wicked has been playing on Broadway since 2003.

Musicals need momentum to build. Shows cannot all be mega hit sensations without a lot of time and investment. Julie Taymoor needed years to create the intricate puppetry that we have come to love in The Lion King. Each time I sit in the audience, it isn't a singular puppet that makes me cry, it is a beautiful ensemble singing "The Circle of Life" as we become totally immersed in the African tundra – a world Julie created from the depths of her imagination.

Small musicals deserve the same tender loving care. Not every story needs 30 actors, a 20 piece orchestra, a backstage crew of 30. Some shows are intimate, and their message implores us lean in and share our most beautiful and tragic moments, sitting together in a theatre.

Over the last 3 decades, Aurora has been finding these musicals and putting them on our stage. That is a part of our DNA. I love these stories, I devote hundreds of hours to searching, meeting composers, in agent negotiations, then I spend countless hours in the rehearsal room, just to get these stories to Aurora's stage. I have found time and time again, that you love these stories too.

King of Pangea is just such a story. I come from a strong family. It is why I talk about my mother all the time. I have been changed by the strength and love of my parents. Purely uproarious moments live there too – what I call The Dysfunction and The Divine.

Despite the importance of the new musical to the American canon of storytelling, most new musicals never get produced. 90% die on the page. THEY DIE. It's a powerful thing DEATH. We too are only here for a finite amount of time so let's make the most of it. Let's invest in these new stories, these stories that only we can tell, because we know the story so deeply.

Pangea is a magical place shared between a mother and her son. Pangea is a doodle on the back of an envelope. Pangea is a place where we never die. Pangea is a lofty idea. Ultimately, Pangea is a RISK.

All of you are asking, "What's the show about?" It's about the incredible embrace of a mother to her child. It is the joy; it is the despair, all of it wrapped up in a messy, beautiful musical that Martin Storrow imagined. I guarantee you that after you see this show, you will dare to stare at the stars, squinting to find the Big Dipper, and longing to know which star is named for you. And you will claim it!!!!

That star is mine!!!

ANN-CAROL **PENCE** (Co-Founder/ Artistic Director/Music Producina **Director**) arranged the music for Aurora's first Christmas Canteen in 1996 and was hired full-time in September of 1998 as Resident Musical Director. An education major at James Madison University, she used her background to develop Aurora's Learning Library (or L2). As a musician, she created Aurora's Musicals by Moonlight, and Aurora's New Musical Initiative. She has performed as pianist and music director both nationally (Goodspeed Opera House, Pasadena Playhouse, The Cleveland Playhouse, The Kennedy Center) and locally (The Alliance, Theatrical Outfit, Horizon Theatre, Georgia Ensemble Theatre). As a proud citizen of Gwinnett, Ann-Carol is most proud of Aurora Theatre winning the first ever Pinnacle Award for Large Non-Profit, and the first ever Moxie Award (for womanled businesses) for Aurora Theatre. These distinctions go well with her 5 Suzi Awards for Outstanding Music Direction. She was a participant in the 2016 Atlanta Regional Commission's Regional Leadership Institute and member of the "Best Class Ever!"

ANTHONY RODRIGUEZ (Co-Founder/ Artistic Director Emeritus) is a seasoned nonprofit leader and the newly appointed Executive Director of the South Forsyth County Community Improvement District. A dynamic force in the arts community, he previously served as the President and CEO of Aurora Theatre, a professional theater he co-founded with Ann-Carol Pence nearly 29 years ago. His commitment to community and the arts extends beyond his directorial roles; he is an active member on multiple boards, including the Georgia Hispanic Chamber of Commerce, where he contributes as Treasurer for the National Alliance for Musical Theatre, and the Advisory Board of Public Broadcasting Atlanta, which encompasses NPR station WABE and PBS station PBS30. A graduate of several prestigious leadership programs, including the Atlanta Regional Commission's Regional Leadership Institute, Leadership Atlanta (2022), and the National Association of Latino Arts and Cultures' Leadership and Advocacy Institutes, Anthony's leadership abilities have been recognized broadly. He is proud to be included in the Georgia Trend Notable Georgians list and Atlanta Magazine's 500 Most Influential list. Born in New York and raised in Atlanta, Anthony holds a Bachelor of Fine Arts in Theatre from the University of Georgia. His passion for the arts and community empowerment continues to drive his work, inspiring future generations in both fields.

MARTIN STORROW (Playwright, Compser, **Lyricist**) believes that our stories can change everything. A prolific writer, composer, and lyricist, Martin has created multiple albums and singles and a collection of poems. His music has been featured in film and television shows on NBC, Starz, and Netflix, and he has performed more than a thousand live concerts across the U.S. and around the globe. 
KATIE IVEY* (Stage Manager) is so excited to be the Stage Manager for King of



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
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


